Survival Clauses

Purpose -

 Extends or contracts the statute of limitations for certain rights and obligations.

Concerns -

- What provisions?
- How long?
- Watch out if you want to extend the indemnity period past the statute of limitations period.



Choice of Laws

Purpose -

 To set the laws that would govern any disputes regarding the contract.

Concerns -

- What laws would be best?
- What laws can govern?
 - Is there a statute allowing you to chose that state's laws?
 - Do you have enough contacts?
 - Internal Affairs Doctrine



Dispute Resolution

Purpose -

 To decide where or how disputes following the closing would be handled.

Issues -

- Forum Selection Clause
 - Mandatory or Permissive?
 - · What Forum State or Federal?
- Arbitration?
- Mediation?
- Consent to Service of Process?



Waiver Clauses

Purpose -

 Generally in contracts, a waiver clause is an acknowledgment that in order to waive a contract provision, wuch waiver must be in writing.

Issues -

 Conduct in practice is not always consistent with contract language.



Severability

Purpose -

 In the event that one clause of a contract is found unenforceable, a court will sever the unenforceable clause and find the rest of the contract enforceable.

Issues:

- Blue penciling
- Virginia laws



Assignment

Purpose -

 Under common law, parties can freely assign rights and obligations to a contract. Typically, parties wish to block that free assignment.

Issues -

- Not always needed.
- Should one party have the right to freely assign?
- · Special instances where one can assign.



Integration/Merger Clauses

Purpose -

To have the entire agreement in the written contract.

Issues -

- Parol evidence rule.
- Consider the language with multiple agreements or if there has been diligence.
- Under UCC Art. 2, evidence of past practice can be admissible.
